From the desk of Father Carlyle

Q. In the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I) we pray, "Remember, Lord, your servants, and all gathered here, whose faith and devotion are known to you. For them, we offer you this sacrifice of praise or they offer it for themselves and all who are dear to them: for the redemption of their souls, in hope of health and well-being, and paying their homage to you, the eternal God, living and true." Who are those for whom "we offer you this sacrifice", and who are those who "offer it for themselves?"

A. Those for whom "we offer you this sacrifice "are living persons we're praying for who are not present. Those who "offer it for themselves" are the people participating in that Mass. Fr. Josef Jungmann, the great Jesuit liturgical scholar writes of this prayer, "the circle is broadened. Into it are drawn all those present, since they did come to church in order to honor God by this communal oblation." But "those whose names were to be recalled...were often not present at the Mass, so that the priest was also their representative..."

"Our Savior instituted the Eucharistic sacrifice of his Body and Blood. This he did in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the cross throughout the ages until he should come again..." (The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of the Second Vatican Council) When we participate in the Mass, we join our sacrifice of prayer and praise to Our Lord's perpetual Sacrifice, and we have the privilege applying the spiritual fruit of the Holy Sacrifice not only for ourselves but for all who are dear to us. In order to participate fully and actively, it's a good idea to call to mind, at this point in the Mass, the particular persons and concerns for whom we wish to pray. You can even plan ahead. And when someone asks you to pray for them, you can offer to remember them at Mass. Then, remember them here!
